Access to Head Start in Iowa

5,718

Funded Head Start (HS) Slots



32% of eligible children ages3 - 5 had access to HS

1,546

Funded *Early Head Start* (EHS) Slots

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6% of eligible children under 3 had access to EHS

These slots filled 543 classrooms in lowa.

Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)



2.3 x Children in poverty are 2.3 times more likely to suffer from 3 or more ACEs. ACEs include abuse, neglect, homelessness, parental substance abuse, or foster care.

Research shows that as the number of ACEs increases, so does the risk of lifelong negative outcomes.

Iowa's Head Start Workforce



2,095 HS and EHS jobs in Iowa In Iowa, the average Head Start teacher with a bachelor's degree makes **\$31,257** per year, compared to an average kindergarten teacher salary of **\$51,140**.
